



During the Kyouwa Era (1801~1803) There were 4 houses (Shi ken) in the Shiken-cho area and it is from those 4 houses that Shikencho got its name.

Tokuzyoji Temple was originally along the Hokuriku main highway, but in 1880 it was moved to its current location. The current location was also one of the prefectural storage areas for those traveling with large groups and luggage. In 1764, Chiju Kawase created a monument for Basho on the grounds of Tokuzyouji. As a memorial for the 70th anniversary of Bashou's death, an inscription of a poem from "Oku no Hosomichi" was engraved on the front of the monument.
